

Edward Yeadon Wadeson, Bramham.

Lieutenant Edward Yeadon **WADESON**, 3rd (Reserve) Bn. attached 10th (S) Bn. Loyal North Lancashire Regiment*, 112th Bde., 27th Division, date of death 22/03/1918, aged 22. Son of Reverend Edward Gustavus Wadeson**, of Bramham Vicarage, Boston Spa, Yorks, and the late Margaret Elizabeth Wadeson (née Yeadon). Educated at Selwyn College, Cambridge.

No known grave, commemorated on Bay 7. Arras Memorial, France.

* Battalion disbanded 4th February 1918 in France.

Parents married on the 25th September 1888 in West Kirby, Cheshire.

Edward Yeadon Wadeson was born at Thornton-le-Street, near Thirsk, on the 17th January 1895.

Edward was educated at Tadcaster Grammar School (1906-7), Worksop College (1908-1913) and Pocklington School (1913-14), the Selwyn College, Cambridge.

During the Great War he was commissioned into the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment.

He was wounded in 1916 and killed in action during the German Spring Offensive in 1918.

His mother died in July 1914 and his father died in September 1926.

His sister Winifred married and moved to New Zealand.
