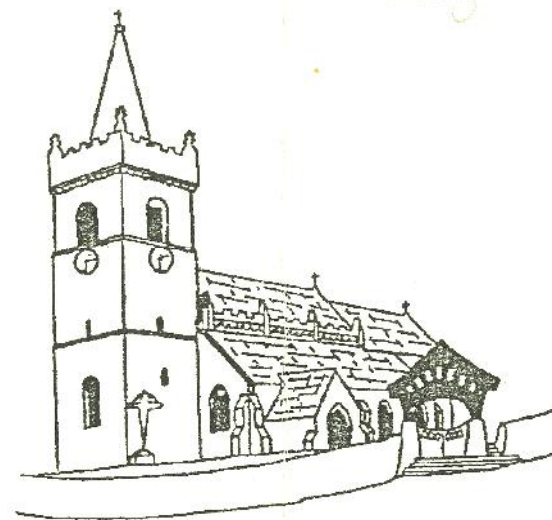


EXCHANGE OF VOWS
