First levied 1692. Each county required to raise a quota of national tax; various bases in each county:-

1. profits & salaries.
2. value of goods & merchandise.
3. annual value of the land, taken to be the current rent.

became increasingly concentrated on land, entirely so after 1733.
Rate of tax. early 18th; varied 1/10 to 4/10 but 4/10 after 1772 (in the form of a poll tax)
Also used for political purposes - record for voting qualifications 1779-1832
