## The Mill House & Windmill

The mill and farm were part of the Headley Estate until acquired by the Bramham Park Estate around 1900. The windmill is described in the book [p.60], and has, in very recent years, become a less obvious village marker, owing to the trees which have been allowed to grow around it. The site was sold by the Park in the 1970 's, since when it has been occupied as a private residence.
