#### Bramham Man Downs A Dornier.

Pilot-Officer G. Fisher, whose home is at Rochleigh, Bramham, shot down his first enemy raider, a Dornier 217, recently. The encounter took place in the early hours of the morning a hundred miles out at sea. In the fight, Pilot-Officer Fisher's plane was damaged, but he managed to return safely. He is well known in Bramham and district. After a commercial college education, he turned to music, when it was found that he had a fine baritone voice. After two years private tuition, he attended first Trinity College, London, and then the Royal College, London, from where he volunteered for the R.A.F. in February, 1940. He joined a Night Fighter Squadron in August, 1941, and has done operational convoy and night patrols continuously since. He was commissioned in March this year.
